Family and friends can be a great source of support, but constantly sharing updates can be exhausting and impractical. CaringBridge replaces countless texts and emails with an online, private, personal journal that is easy to set up, update, and share.

Travel Assistance

For those affected by cancer, travel to obtain medical treatment can be expensive. Beat the Odds provides financial support to the following organizations to assist with travel expenses. Each organization has their own contacts and procedures. Financial assistance is based on reimbursement of expenses; receipts must be provided. Families are not asked about their income or assets. The Petersburg Medical Center Patient Navigator can facilitate connections to these organizations.

First City Council on Cancer is a Ketchikanbased all-volunteer organization that provides financial assistance for cancer patients in southern Southeast Alaska. Grant applications to reimburse expenses can be completed online or printed and mailed **to PO Box 8832 Ketchikan AK 99901.**

Cancer Connection is a Juneau-based nonprofit organization that assists Southeast Alaska residents traveling for cancer treatment. A one-bedroom fully furnished Seattle apartment is available on a firstcome, first serve basis for patients needing a place to stay during treatment or testing.

Angel Flight West is a nonprofit, volunteer-driven organization that arranges free, non-emergency air travel for children and adults with serious medical conditions such as cancer. Angel Flight West has a partnership with Alaska Airlines to provide transportation for Alaska residents to seek medical treatment within Alaska or to the Lower 48. A travel companion may also be accommodated. Requests must be made by a referring medical agency, doctor's office, or hospital social worker or patient navigator. angelflightwest.org

Beat the Odds is part of the Petersburg Medical Center Foundation. The Foundation was founded in 1990 and renamed in February 2000.

Support and Services

Petersburg Medical Center has a Patient Navigator, who will connect cancer patients, caregivers and families with chore services, special equipment and supplies, counseling, travel assistance funds, and other resources.

The Patient Navigator can be reached at (907) 772-5716.

When families are dealing with cancer and cancer treatments, everyday tasks can become overwhelming. Beat the Odds has funded chore services: someone to help with housework, meals, and other needs.

Sometimes those with cancer need special equipment or supplies. Petersburg Medical Center Home Health has a lending closet with equipment, including beds, walkers and wheelchairs Petersburg Rexall Drug can help locate items for purchase or rent.

Petersburg Cancer Support Group is a free, unstructured, anonymous gathering of people impacted by cancer facilitated by True North Counseling & Consultation, LLC. Discussions range widely and may include recovery strategies such as nutrition and exercise, dealing with fear, loss and grief, celebration of good test results, or advice about doctors and hospitals. True North Counseling & Consultation, LLC is also able to provide one-on-one counseling and consultation services to adults, couples, adolescents, children, families dealing with cancer. They can provide alternative fees to those in need and can provide a limited number of sessions free.
